

### **ALLEN B. WEST Biography**

Lt. Col. West believes it will be principled constitutional conservative policies, not politics, which secures a sound economic future for Americans – with growth, opportunity and returning the promise of the American dream for this generation and those to come.

He is the third of four generations of military servicemen in his family. During his 22- year career in the United States Army, Lieutenant Colonel West served in several combat zones and received many honors including a Bronze Star, three Meritorious Service Medals, three Army Commendation Medals, one with Valor device, and a Valorous Unit Award. In 1993 he was named the US Army ROTC Instructor of the Year.

In November of 2010, Allen was elected to the United States Congress, representing Florida's 22nd District. As a member of the 112th Congress, he sat on the Small Business and Armed Services Committees and was instrumental in passage of the 2011 and 2012 National Defense Authorization Acts.

He is a Newsmax TV Contributor, Senior Fellow of the Media Research Center, and author of <u>Guardian of the Repub-</u> <u>lic: An American Ronin's Journey to Family, Faith and Freedom, Hold Texas, Hold the Nation: Victory or Death,</u> and <u>We Can Overcome: An American Black Conservative Manifesto</u>.

He is the former Executive Director of the National Center for Policy Analysis in Dallas Texas, and a former Director of the Booker T. Washington Initiative (BTWI) for the Texas Public Policy Foundation.

In July of 2020, Mr. West was elected Chairman of the Republican Party of Texas by and overwhelming majority of State delegates.

West is an avid distance runner, a Master SCUBA diver, a motorcyclist, and in his spare time he enjoys cheering his beloved Tennessee Volunteers.

Lt. Col. West is a commissioned officer in the Texas State Guard. Lt. Col. West is a legacy life member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, life member of the American Legion, life member of the Association of the United States Army, the Society of the First Infantry Division, 4th Infantry Division, and 101st Airborne Division. He is Patriot Life Member (Benefactor) and Board of Directors member of the National Rifle Association and Life Member (Benefactor) of the Texas State Rifle Association. Lieutenant Colonel West is an inductee into the University of Tennessee Army ROTC Hall of Fame. He is on the Board of Advisors of Amegy Bank, Dallas Region. In 2016, Lt. Col. West was appointed by Texas Lt. Gov. Dan Patrick to the Texas Sunset Advisory Commission.

He is married to Dr. Angela Graham-West, a financial adviser, and they have two daughters, Aubrey, a Board-certified Physician Assistant, and Austen, a software sales consultant.





### **Texas Legislative Update**

#### Texas Gains Two Congressional Seats in Census Update

#### More Than Any Other State

Texas was the top recipient of the 2020 apportionment release by the U.S. Census Bureau, picking up two congressional seats.

After a three million population increase over the last decade, Texas will grow its congressional district total to 38.

The U.S. House of Representatives was constitutionally locked at 435 members with the Permanent Apportionment Act of 1929, meaning congressional seats cannot be created or destroyed — just transferred from one state to another.

Texas was one of six states to gain seats while seven lost one. Its total population increased nearly 4 million, topping out at 29,145,505.

Another part of congressional representation that changed was the constituents per district, increasing from 698,488 to 766,987.


With the preliminary totals now available, the decennial process for redrawing Texas' congressional and state legislative districts will begin to speed up.

The number of Texas' state legislative districts, unlike its federal counterpart, is locked at 31 and 150 for the Senate and House, respectively. So, while the constituency per district will increase, the number of elected representatives will not.

The Texas Demographic Center estimated earlier this year that the state Senate districts would increase in size to just shy of 1 million residents per district — substantially larger than the congressional districts.

That projection overshot the result by about 50,000 residents. The population per state House district will be just over 194,000.

Like most redistricting efforts, this year's is likely to be drawn out and bogged down with legal challenges.



Due to coronavirus, the Census Bureau's project was delayed and the delivery of its data to the states may not come until September 30. That means Texas will be behind the eight ball to draw its legislative districts before the 2022 primaries.

With a month left in the 87th regular session, it is all but certain that the state legislature will convene a special session just to tackle the issue — meaning that after a year of inaction, a dash to the finish is expected.

Texas' population is clearly growing at a significant rate — and with it, the state's political influence at the national level.
