



Honoring Our Veterans Veterans Day, November 11, 2022

Editor's Note: We found this comprehensive write-up of the history of Veterans Day on a site called "National Today." We've reprinted the lightly edited article below.



Veterans Day, originally celebrated as Armistice Day, was first issued on November 11, 1919, by President Woodrow Wilson a year after the end of World War I. The purpose of Armistice Day was to honor the fallen soldiers of the Great War for their sacrifice and bravery.

Seven years later, in 1926, Congress adopted a resolution requesting that President Calvin Coolidge issue annual proclamations on November 11, making Armistice Day a legal holiday.

In 1945, World War II veteran Raymond Weeks had the idea to expand Armistice Day to celebrate all veterans rather than just the ones who died in World War I. He led a delegation to General Dwight Eisenhower, who was all for the idea. Weeks then organized the first Veterans Day celebration in 1945 in Alabama and every year since, until he died in 1985. In 1982, he was honored by President Reagan with the Presidential Citizenship Medal.

In 1954, Ed Rees, the U.S. Representative from Emporia, Kansas, presented a bill to establish the holiday to Congress. Eisenhower, who was then the president and also from Kansas, signed the bill into law on May 26, 1954, eight and a half years after Raymond Weeks held the first Veterans Day. After having been through both World War II and the Korean War, the 83rd U.S. Congress — at the urge of the veterans' service organizations — amended the Act of 1938 by striking out the word 'Armistice' and inserting the word 'Veterans.' With the approval of this legislation on June 1, 1954, November 11 became a day to honor American veterans of all wars.



Camp Shield was created to address the emotional, social, and physical wounds of women veterans, wounds that have contributed to a lower quality of life, emotional instability, and a lack of social engagement as seen in communities across the nation.

Camp Shield's Founder Maggie Peterson, is a former United States Air Force Staff Sergeant.

David Maulsby is executive director of the PTSD Foundation of America which through its Camp Hope facility helps veterans recover from combat-

related post-traumatic stress and to help lower the veteran suicide rate.

Maulsby said about 7,300 military members were killed in Iraq and Afghanistan, but more than 30,000 veterans from Iraq and Afghanistan have died by suicide upon returning home following their service.

Political Strategist Vargas: Democrats and Deception

September Speaker Outlines Dem MO & How to Combat it





"With leftist Democrats, the issue is never the issue," said Political Strategist Joseph Vargas at the September meeting of the Greater Houston Council of Federated Women. "This means their initial complaint (issue) is fake, a mere distraction from the real issue – their real agenda. At the end of the day, the real issue for Democrats is always the same: to deceitfully manipulate the use of emotion, negative branding, selective outrage, and language to push their leftist socialist agenda to attack conservative values."

Joseph Vargas is a strategist commentator with a focus on Ethics in Philosophy and Political Strategy. He is the founder of Keep Texas Red and Vice-President of the Juan Seguin Society.

"The most successful way to confront and respond to an emotional Democrat attack or argument is to first, expose the emotional argument as fake and second, educate the audience of the true intention of the fake emotional argument," he said.

Vargas warned that the goal is to educate the audience and not educate the leftist aggressor because the leftist aggressor more than likely knows the emotional argument is fake.

The Greatest Procrastination

"Talking, meeting, and reading – when accompanied by no strategic action – are the greatest procrastination in political activism," Vargas said. "It solves nothing. Only replacing them with true conservatives will solve the problem.

"Many want to talk about the problem, others want to meet to discuss the problem and others love to read about the problem. But few want to organize to take strategic action. Complaining has no value. Complaining will not replace liberal elected officials."

TFRW Recognizes GHCFRW for "Commitment, Leadership and Support"

At its September, 2022 Board Meeting, the Texas Federation of Republican Women passed a resolution honoring the GHCFRW for its "commitment to TFRW and NFRW, for its leadership and support of Federated Republican Women's clubs, Republican Party Principles, and Republican candidates in the Council region."

The full text of the resolution is below.

To Honor the Greater Houston Council of Federated Republican Women

WHEREAS, the Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) is made up of 162 Federated Republican Women's clubs across the great State of Texas;

WHEREAS, the Greater Houston Council of Federated Republican Women (GHCFRW) is a coalition of 38 of these clubs in 13 counties surrounding the City of Houston;

WHEREAS, the GHCFRW works with TFRW and the National Federation of Republican Women (NFRW) to coordinate and support the member clubs in its council, to foster loyalty to the Republican Party, and to work for the election of the Republican Party's nominees;

WHEREAS, the GHCFRW supports its member clubs with programs and other activities created to encourage membership growth in the individual clubs;

WHEREAS, the GHCFRW provides political education and training to increase the effectiveness of Republican women in the cause of good government;

WHEREAS, the GHCFRW provides valuable resources to its members like its candidate forums, Voter's Guide and Newsletters to maximize Get Out the Vote and voter registration efforts;

WHEREAS, the GHCFRW provided guidance and support in the formation of her sister councils in Dallas and San Antonio;

WHEREAS, the TFRW recognizes the importance of the synergistic effect of the GHCFRW member clubs working together rather than as individual clubs and supports the continuation of such efforts.

RESOLVED, that the Texas Federation of Republican Women at its Fall Board of Directors Meeting, September 16, 2022, expresses its gratitude and appreciation to the Greater Houston Council of Federated Republican Women for its commitment to TFRW and NFRW, and its leadership and support of Federated Republican Women clubs, Republican Party principles, and Republican candidates in the council region;

RESOLVED, that TFRW did hereby vote to recommend amending its bylaws at the 2023 TFRW Convention to demonstrate its commitment to supporting the councils by including the council president as a member of its Board, ex officio, without vote.





Governor Abbott Launches Statewide "One Pill Kills" Campaign



Bonnie Foster Legislative Report

As you all know the Texas Legislature does not start their biennium session until January 10, 2023. However, Governor Abbott and his team are working daily on border issues. I wanted to share this piece with you on their campaign against fentanyl, which is killing our kiddos daily.

Governor Abbott this week announced the launch of the State of Texas' coordinated "One Pill Kills" campaign to combat the growing national fentanyl crisis, which is a deadly byproduct of President Biden's open border policies. Governor Abbott also announced new laws to be considered this upcoming legislative session that would classify fentanyl as a poisoning, allow charging an individual for murder if they distribute fentanyl or drugs laced with fentanyl that kill someone, and make NARCAN more readily available across the state for Texans exposed to fentanyl.

"Fentanyl remains the single deadliest drug threat our state and nation has ever encountered, killing four Texans every day," said Governor Abbott. "In the Biden Administration's negligence to address this national security threat, Texas has designated Mexican drug cartels as terrorist organizations and is launching a statewide public awareness campaign to fight the fentanyl crisis in our state."

Last month, Governor Abbott <u>directed state agency leaders</u> to ramp up efforts to respond to the crisis, including coordinating outreach to raise awareness of fentanyl's lethality and prevalence.
