Greater Houston Council FRW General Meeting Minutes November 15, 2022 Trini Mendenhall Center



1. The meeting was called to order at 10:00 AM by President, Tina Gibson.

2. Opening Prayer by Bylaws/Parliamentarian Deb Cupples.

Pledges to the US Flag and the State of Texas Flag by Justice Kevin Jewell, Fourteenth Court of Appeals.

3. President Tina Gibson recognized elected officials. She thanked Hospitality Chair Edie Holland and the Hospitality Host Clubs: Tomball Republican Women and Baytown Republican Women.

4. 1st VP Programs SJ Swanson said that she was appointed Chair of the Judicial Selection and Recruitment Committee for the Harris County Republican Party (HCRP). She introduced Tina Eldridge, Personnel Officer of Camp Shield. Maggie Peterson, the Camp Shield Founder, was unable to attend. Tina said that Camp Shield provides assistance to women veterans and their children helping them cope after military service. Our members purchased gift cards that SJ presented to Tina Eldridge for the Camp Shield women veterans.

SJ introduced David Maulsby, Executive Director of Camp Hope, PTSD Foundation, that assists veterans with combatrelated PTSD. 85 vets are on campus with 120 beds. SJ presented gift cards and Christmas stockings to David, who was very grateful to GHCFRW.

SJ introduced Jacquie Baly, President of BalyProjects, and a policy analyst for various television and radio stations. A native of St. Croix, U.S. Virgin Islands, Jacquie holds a bachelor's degree in Political Science and a Master's in Public Policy. She has been an Adjunct Professor at the University of Houston for over a decade and served as a Faculty-In-Residence at the University of Texas in Austin.

Jacquie said that Montgomery County voted 48% for Gov. Abbott. She stated that the Harris County election was very close. Alex Mealer lost to County Judge Lina Hidalgo by 16,000 votes. She mentioned that Democrats still support Beto after his losses to Ted Cruz and Gov. Abbott. Democrats are unified and don't care if their candidates are unqualified. She said that the HCRP is suing the Harris County Election Administrator but elections don't get overturned. When Stan Stanart handled elections, we had results at 7:15pm after the polls closed. She feels that we would have had a Red Wave until the Roe vs Wade decision. Latinos are the majority and surpass white voters. Fort Bend has many people of color and was solid red until 2018. 17% of Blacks voted Republican. Jacquie said that Cindy Siegel did a great job as HCRP Chairman. Jacquie doesn't want Republicans to criticize other Republicans. Texas will remain Republican for the next 10 years.

5. 2nd VP Membership Amy Byers called the roll of Member Clubs. She is sending renewal notices to the member clubs.

6. Recording Secretary Mary Sage stated that minutes of the May and September meetings were published in the newsletter. There were no changes. We did not have a quorum to approve the minutes as written.

7. Treasurer Micheline Hutson presented the Treasurer's Report. She said GHC gave funds to Needville RW a new club. GHC sponsored he TFRW Red High Heel Brigade with 50 block walkers.

8. President Tina Gibson presented the President's Report that GHC sponsored the TFRW Red High Heel Brigade organized by Legislative Chair Bonnie Foster to Get Out the Vote by block walking. The Voter Engagement project registered 180,000 voters. Cy Fair RW Past President Gail Schubot made 65,000 calls to register new Republican voters. We need to recruit non-traditional voters and young women.

9. Officer and Committee Chair Reports – Dana Khan reported that we will have an event in late April or in May.

10. Announcements:



Legislative Report

Happy New Year!!! I am going to start this article with important dates to mark on your calendar regarding the 88th Texas Legislature before heading into a wealth of information for all.

- 1) January 10, 2023 88th Texas Legislature convenes at noon
- 2) January 17, 2023 Inauguration of Governor Abbott
- 3) January 17, 2023 Greater Houston Council General Meeting
- 4) February 3, 2023 TFRW Legislative Day in Austin
- 5) March 10, 2023 Deadline to file bills
- 6) May 29, 2023 Legislative session ends

As Republican Women we are very involved, however some of us may be new to the political scene and some of us may have just made a move to the great state of Texas. Here is just a little information to share with you:

Our Representation at the Federal Level

While Senators are evenly sent from the states (2 per state), the Representatives are by population, generally (see below). Texas has two representatives in the United State Senate – senior Senator John Cornyn from San Antonio, and junior Senator Ted Cruz from Houston. Each senator represents the entire state. The senators serve staggered six-year terms. As a little reference point, Senator Cornyn was just reelected in 2020 for six more years and Senator Cruz will be up for reelection in 2024. The 117th Congress will convene in January 2023.

Our U.S. Congress has stayed steady at 435 members for more than 100 years. This is because the Permanent Apportionment Act of 1929 "froze" the number of representatives at that time (actually, as had been in place since 1913). In short, following the U.S. Census in 1920 there was a battle between the rural and urban areas of the United States for the number of reps. The prior formula favored urban areas to the detriment of rural areas, and Congress could not agree on an apportionment plan. So instead, it passed the Act and fixed the number of Representatives as they were per the 1910 census. The argument still rages about whether to move away (up or down urban vs. rural).

Going into 117th Congress there will be 222 Republicans and 213 Democrats. Texas gained two additional Congressional seats from the 2020 census. One is in the Austin area and the other is in Harris County. The Austin district is CD37 and was won by a Democrat. The other seat is CD38 won by a strong conservative; West Point graduate and former Apache Helicopter Pilot in the Army – Wesley Hunt.

Our Representation on the State Level

Our State's legislative branch meets only every two years in odd years. The last session was the 87th Texas Legislature which met in regular session in 2021 and a whole lot of Special Sessions. All 150 seats in the Texas House are up for election every two years. The Texas state Senators are by districts and are elected for four-year terms. The easiest way to find your district is to head to the Secretary of State's office at this link: <u>https://www.sos.state.tx.us/elections/voter/current.shtml</u>

A little fact for this upcoming Texas Legislature and I am including a link to the article, but the 88th Texas Legislature will have the most women serving in Texas state history. Yee Haw!!! 2023 Is Convention Year

The coming year will be a busy one for TFRW. Mark your calendars for the NFRW Convention in Oklahoma City, Sept. 28-30 and the TFRW Convention in Irving, Oct. 11-14. The NFRW and TFRW conventions always bring in outstanding speakers, so plan to attend, if possible.

Bylaws

Now is a good time to be reviewing your club's bylaws and be thinking of any changes you would like to make to them. NFRW requires all State Federations to adopt a standard template. Generally, once the new TFRW template is implemented, clubs requesting a bylaws review after a designated date will use the new template. TFRW clubs whose bylaws have not been updated since 2018 or earlier will be required to update their bylaws in 2023. Clubs who have updated their bylaws since 2019 will be asked to monitor any bylaw amendments that are approved at the 2023 Convention and update their bylaws if amendments are added.

TFRW Legislative Day February 3, 2023

TFRW Legislative Day is on Friday, February 3rd, and it will be a day of training and presentations by an amazing cast of Republicans with extensive experience in Texas government. We recognize that Biden's inflation has impacted us all, so we are holding our registration cost at 2021 levels – Early Bird registration for Legislative Day and Luncheon will be \$85.

Hotel rates at the AT&T Conference Center are \$219 per night excluding taxes and parking. This is the lowest price available in the immediate area, so you'll want to book your hotel room as soon as possible.

The last day to file a bill (the 60th day) is March 10th, but thousands of bills will be filed prior to the beginning of the session. Returning incumbents began filing bills on November 14th, so hundreds of bills have been filed.

As an organization, TFRW primarily will follow bills relating to Education and Election Integrity. These two legislative priorities may encompass dozens of bills, so we will keep you posted about the ones we are following that are moving (to committee hearing and beyond). And, Legislative Day training will prepare you to follow these bills and as well as those in which you have a personal interest and show you how to share your opinions and feedback to committees and representatives handling those bills.
