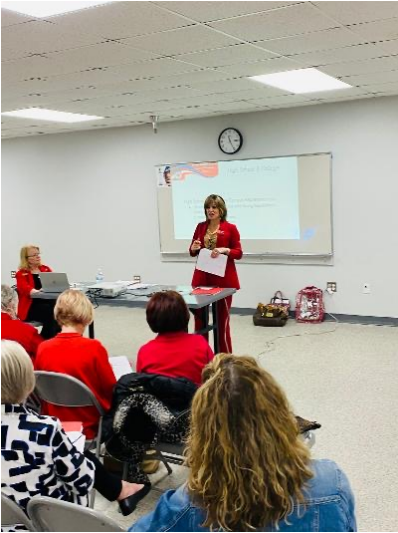
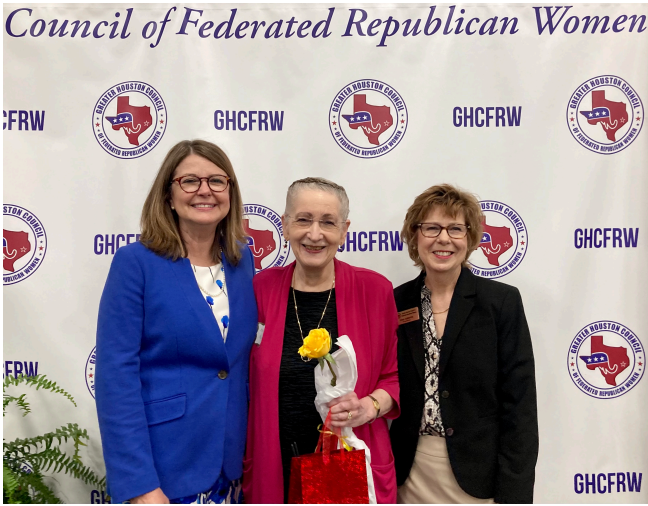

We corresponded from Houston to Dallas to make this Handbook work! Frances was the technical editor for the GHC President's Leadership Handbook. Due to her expertise in MS Word, incredible attention to detail, and ability to create a uniform format, the Handbook looks very professional.

I'd have to say that we Kahlichs were Republican before Republicanism was cool in rural Texas. One of my most vivid memories was sitting on Daddy's lap watching Nixon win the Presidential nomination in 1968! Nixon's The One!

My mother, Elvera Kahlich, was always active in our small town of Weimar. Although she never ran for office, (But Dad was Mayor for a few years!), she was usually an officer in many of the local organizations, and we grew up knowing that if you wanted something done, you didn't sit on the sidelines. She and Dad were the Colorado County delegates to the RPT Convention for a number of years, and she was the Presiding Judge at the local elections. So, when I became the GHC Corresponding Secretary and tasked with producing the President's Leadership Handbook (PLH), I knew I could count on her and her 40 years of experience! The two of us corresponded from our homes in Houston and Dallas to make this Handbook work! I marveled at her ability to easily merge the information from Excel spreadsheets into the Word document and create a beautiful resource that is easy to read for our member club presidents. She is even providing instructions and guidelines to follow for future editors!

Realistically, it normally takes a full day or more for a measure to reach the Calendar Committee after the measure has been reported from committee.</div> <div>Note 2: The House rules do not have an express deadline for distributing calendars on the 120th, 121st, 128th, 132nd, and 133rd days. This calendar presumes that the House will convene at 9 a.m. for a local and consent calendar and at 10 a.m. for a daily or supplemental calendar.</div> <div>Note 3: The Senate deadline for passing all bills and joint resolutions does not take into consideration the House deadline for passing Senate bills and joint resolutions. Realistically, to be eligible for consideration by the House under its end-of-session deadlines, Senate bills and joint resolutions must be passed by the Senate and received by the House before the 130th day.</div> <div>Note 4: Both Senate and House rules require a 48-hour layout for a resolution suspending limitations on a conference committee considering the general appropriations bill, if such a resolution is necessary. Neither rule has an express deadline for considering that resolution, which should occur before consideration of the general appropriations bill.</div> </div> | | | | |

GHC President Tina Gibson called the General Meeting to Order at 9:16 a.m. She welcomed all of the attendees and recognized the GHC board members.

Ronnye Cowell, Village Republican Women corresponding secretary and TFRW Senate District 7 Director offered a prayer and led the pledges to the United States and Texas flags.

Amy Byers, GHC 2nd VP of Membership conducted an official roll call for voting, and to determine attendance of members by each Council club. Following the roll call, she announced a quorum was present. Twenty-eight of the thirty-one Council clubs were present.

President Gibson recognized elected officials and candidates present.

President Gibson then explained the Rules for voting at GHC general meetings.

GHC Treasurer Micheline Hutson presented a report on the Council's finances and the budget as approved and recommended by the Budget Committee. A vote was called to approve the budget as presented, and the vote was unanimous in favor.

As Deb Cupples was unable to attend the meeting, President Gibson presented a report on the Bylaws including proposed changes to bring the Council's bylaws in line with TFRW's, and noted that the proposed amended GHCFRW bylaws as had been submitted to all clubs. A vote was called to approve the amended Bylaws as presented, and the vote was unanimous in favor.

President Gibson called Pearl Maggio then recognized all GHC Clubs 2023 Presidents, calling them each to the stage to be announced. Each club President was presented with a rose and a bag with a GHC lapel pin, a set of tabletop U.S. and Texas flags and a stand for use in club board meetings, and a patriotic keychain. Each President had her photo taken with GHC President Tina Gibson and TFRW President Kit Whitehall.

President Gibson turned the meeting over to Amy Byers, Chair of the 2023 "Original" Nuts 'N Bolts program. Byers gave an introduction to Nuts 'N Bolts and outlined what would happen for the rest of the day. Byers introduced the various session speakers, panels, and programs and directed participants to the various meeting rooms for sessions.

Presentations included: Legislative by Pat Morlen (Kingwood Area RW); Treasurer 101 by Micheline Hutson (Cy-Fair and Council Treasurer); Meeting Protocol/Parliamentarian/How to Run a Successful Meeting by Betsy Kindred (West Pearland); Membership by Barbara Eddleman (MCRW) and Carrie Butler (LCARW); Remarks by TFRW President Kit Whitehill; Club Presidents Roundtable; Fundraising/Campaign Activities by Marilyn Davis and Corrine Miklosh (TFRW); Treasurer 102 by Micheline Hutson; Newsletter and Website by Julie Faubel (LCARW); and Social Media Dos and Don'ts by Melody Briggs (TFRW).

Following the "Original" Nuts 'N Bolts program, President Gibson asked all to fill out the program evaluations and turn them in. She made announcements about the next general meeting (May 16th) and other events, and certain clubs made announcements of their own meetings and events.

President Gibson adjourned the meeting at approximately 1:55 p.m.
