May General Meeting Highlights

May Meeting Showcases Proud Texas History

Texas is approaching its Bicentennial birthday as a state and many are getting ready for the 2036 celebration now. GHC hosted the Texas Rangers who spoke on their 200th anniversary. The morning was not without a huge dose of our proud Texas history. Texas Ranger Russell Molina and former Ranger Chief Tony Leal spoke about the Rangers as the state's chief law enforcement that Stephen F. Austin established in1823 to protect newly settled colonists who relocated from other parts of the United States to the Mexican province, now known as Texas. Rangers fought and died at the Alamo. Present day, they have many duties including the heavily entrenched agents at the Texas border to help keep it secure.

Russell has been working on the Bicentennial for seven years. He is raising funds for a monument to the Rangers in Austin, and he is working on a travel trailer displaying the history of the Texas Rangers.

Chief Leal stated details about the Texas Rangers' operations. The Texas Rangers are a division of the Texas Department of Public Safety. The Rangers conduct major violent crime, public corruption, cold case and officer involved shooting investigations and oversee the department's border security and tactical and crisis negotiation programs. He stated that Texas Rangers are the oldest and finest law enforcement agency.

The Texas Rangers will be traveling around Texas to promote their Bi-Centennial birthday and will speak to your club or any organization that loves the state of Texas. The Texas Rangers Museum is located in Waco, Texas.



Also present was Justice Ken Wise. He is a member of the 14th Court of Appeals, Texas Judicial Council and a director of the Judicial Section of the State Bar of Texas. He is the creator and host of the award-winning Texas history podcast *Wise About Texas*. Justice Wise also sits on the board of Texas State Historical Association.

Legislation Report, Bonnie Foster

From Robbi Hull, TFRW VP Legislation's "Legislative Wrap Up"

Ladies, you were amazing this session. Your level of participation was phenomenal, and we applaud your dedication to the process. As you know, the 88th Biennial Legislative Session adjourned sine die on May 29th. Pursuant to Article IV, Sec. 14 of the Texas Constitution, for bills that passed the legislature but were presented to the Governor within 10 days of the May 29th adjournment, the Governor had 20 days or until June 18th to either sign or veto those bills. Bills that are neither signed nor vetoed become law without the Governor's signature (become law by the operation of law).[1] For a full list of bills that the Governor signed, the Governor vetoed or that became law without the Governor's signature, click **here** and choose the relevant link.

According to legislative statistics on Texas Legislature Online, the number of bills that passed the legislature was 1,246 (this does not include resolutions, joint resolutions or concurrent resolutions). The number of bills filed totaled 8,046 (again, excluding any type of resolution). The Governor vetoed 76 of the 1,246 bills. The rest have become law either with or without his signature.

You will recall that TFRW's legislative priorities this session were election integrity, education and

border security. This *Legislative Wrap-up* is intended to give an overview of the bills that TFRW focused on this session. We had some victories, and we also had more-than-some disappointments, but the legislative process was designed to be a balancing of interests. We understood going into the session that we cannot win on everything (even if we want to)! That is not to say that some of our disappointments seemed to be no-brainer bills or resolutions that should have passed. We will hope to hear from those involved as to why these bills or concurrent resolutions never made it out of committee.

At the outset, we want to congratulate our representatives for finally passing legislation that will protect minors from irreversible gender modification procedures and treatments. **SB 14** is a thoughtful piece of legislation championed by two doctors in the legislature (Senator Donna Campbell and Representative Tom Oliverson), among others. We also congratulate our Representatives on ending the threat of future COVID-related mandates. **SB 29** prohibits governmental entities from implementing or enforcing COVID-related vaccine, mask and business or school closure mandates. Both bills were signed by the Governor on June 2nd and will be effective September 1st, 2023.

Looking Back to 1969 and the Republican Woman's Meat Cookbook

I stopped in an estate sale on my street a few weeks ago. After perusing the many kitchen tools, nice cookware, and beautiful serving pieces and utensils and selected a few. I knew there had to be some cookbooks for a kitchen outfitted such as this one, so I asked.

The woman in charge got up and opened a closed cabinet. She got a little misty-eyed as she told me she wanted to keep some of her mom's cookbooks but hadn't had time to go through them. She said we could look through them together, but she had first dibs. As we went through the shelves, with me pulling and

turning each book, she told me about them and her mom's wonderful cooking. She made a pile of quite a few books to keep.

When I pulled out a well-worn spiral bound "Meats" cookbook, she didn't say anything, so I put it in my pile. When I put on my glasses to examine it better, I got a little thrill to see the full title - *The Republican Woman's Cookbook MEATS* by the National Federation of Republican Women, published in 1969. I love books, and I really love cookbooks - especially older ones. Jackpot! (Or perhaps stew pot?).

As I read through the cookbook, I was struck and surprised by several things. First, how many of the Republican women who submitted recipes were from California! I was pleased there were so many out there then, and wished there were more of us there now. Second, how few of the RWs represented in the book were from Texas and the South (except for Florida, which



was well represented), and how many were from Northern states. Another thing that struck me was how many ingredients came out of a can then! I remember that as I was growing up and am grateful that we are blessed with the amazing abundance of fresh fruits, vegetables, and meats now.

When this cookbook was published in 1969, NFRW's President Gladys O'Donnell (1968-1971) hailed from California. Maybe that explains the outsized number of recipes from her home state. During President O'Donnell's term NFRW published (at least) two other cookbooks. In 1970, the Desserts cookbook hit the market, and in 1971, the Holiday Cookbook was released.

In 2012, the *Financial Times magazine* included an article by Polly Russell entitled "The History Cook: NFRW's Republican Woman's Holiday Cookbook", with a subtitle "As America's political wives campaigned from their kitchens, an ideological battle simmered".



There are some things that the British may never understand about Americans. One is their capacity for organized enthusiasm. Another is a combination of jelly [jello in American English] with mayonnaise in so-called salads. These two aspects of American life, jelly and enthusiasm, feature prominently in the 1971 NFRW Republican Woman's Holiday Cookbook, a fundraising tool for the National Federation of Republican Women.

The NFRW was set up, in 1938, to train future women leaders and to support the Republican party through fundraising and voter recruitment. By the 1950s its emphasis on training had dwindled and the organization was primarily committed to the "housework of government": those aspects of political life - cake sales, election dinners and voter drives - deemed too tedious for men. Focused on 16 markers of celebration, such as New Year's

eve, Lincoln's Birthday and Halloween, the Holiday Cookbook encourages the faithful to show their support by throwing a good party. "Republican women" the book declares, "are active women. They work hard on behalf of their party's candidates and take part in getting out the vote. And, of course, they are involved in fundraising projects. Many of these projects are focused on cooking for lots of people...a meeting to plan a strategy campaign...a supper party for block workers...or, best of all, a victory celebration!"

Since officially taking over the GHC Historian role this year I've been gathering and organizing not only the current term's activities and memorabilia for posterity, but also searching and researching for some of our 61-year-old Council's more ancient history. I've been thinking about ways to share some of this with our member clubs in digestible bites. With pun intended, I'm serving up the first of these bites here with some excerpts and old-school recipes gathered by NFRW from Republican women's clubs across the country more than fifty years ago in *The Republican Woman's MEATS cookbook*. I hope you enjoy reading and perhaps trying some of them in your own kitchens. As Julia Child would say - *Bon appetite*!
