Recognizing TFRW Members Contributions to the Republican Party

It has come to our attention that there are a few Temporary Chairs of Nominations Committees who have publicly stated that they do not want to seat Delegates who are part of TFRW. As the largest grassroots organization in the state at more than 11,000 members, this is unfortunate as our organization has done everything in our power to work with the Republican Party of Texas and be a strong partner organization. Specifically, over the past few years TFRW has:

- Registered 169,160 new voters while working with the Voter Engagement Project. This accounted for:
 - 10% of Governor Abbott's margin and 11% of Lt. Governor Patrick's margin.
 - 24% of Congresswoman Monica De La Cruz's margin, 49% of State Representative Janie Lopez's margin and 15-55% of the margin for 14 other Texas House seats.
- Volunteered more than 3,395,353 hours door-knocking, phone-banking and other various Get-Out-The-Vote measures for the Republican ticket.
- Currently, our organization is recruiting 1,000 volunteers to help register 150,000 new voters for this cycle! We have already registered 41,000 new voters for 2024.

Our membership has consistently worked for Republicans up and down the ballot every cycle and will continue to do so. To the Temporary Chairs who don't think that our membership has done enough to be seated or because they disagree with what we stand for, that's unfortunate. The Texas Federation of Republican Women will always be committed to being united in the singular focus of getting Republicans elected up and down the ballot. We hope you reconsider your stance and recognize that the convention and Delegate process is supposed to represent the collective voice of Republican voters.



Victory by Mary Jane Avery, TFRW Victory Chair - Pledge to Vote Early

Legislation

Hello everyone,

I am sharing this information which can be found in the current TFRW newsletter. I recently attended the TFRW 2nd Quarterly meeting and these bills were discussed.

Specific Bills NFRW is Championing:

ECONOMY

H.R. 7024, The Tax Relief for American Families and Workers Act of 2024.

This bill passed the House Ways and Means Committee with a bi-partisan 40-3 vote. The bill provides several extensions to the Trump tax cuts of 2017.

These cuts began to phase out at the end of 2022. This bill provides positive business and tax provisions that promote growth. However, there are some concerns about the expansion of the Child Tax Credit which does not have guardrails to ensure this valuable tax relief benefits only American families. NFRW and TFRW advocate that appropriate guardrails be placed in the legislation and moved to the full Congress.

H.R. 277 (S.184), Regulations from the Executive in Need of Scrutiny (REINS) Act of 2023.

This bill has passed the house and remains sitting in the Senate. This bill would reassert Congress' legislative authority and prevent excessive overreach by the executive branch in the federal rulemaking process. This bill would fuel economic growth and provide necessary regulatory reform.

BORDER SECURITY

While NFRW supports **H.R. 2**, it is caught in partisan gridlock and therefore NFRW is championing two important incremental legislative initiatives to address the border crisis.

S.333, Keep Our Communities Safe Act of 2023.

This bill would close the Obama-Biden catch and release policy.

H.R. 6976, Protect Our Communities from DUI's Act.

This bill would force the deportation of illegal immigrants who have been convicted or committed the offense of driving impaired.

In addition, NFRW and TFRW supports a comprehensive, robust border security package that must:

- End Asylum Fraud
- End "Catch and Release"
- Finish the Border Wall
- Increase Border Patrol resources in conjunction with closing loopholes in the immigration system
- Mandate E-Verify to ensure legal employment
- Oppose amnesty in any form

PARENTAL RIGHTS

S.3571, Families' Rights and Responsibilities Act.

NFRW and TFRW support this bill because it prevents the federal government from infringing on the fundamental rights of parents without passing the strict scrutiny test. This Act would:

- Affirm parents have the fundamental right to raise their children and direct their education according to their values
- Prevent the federal government from substantially burdening this fundamental right without first passing the strict scrutiny test
- Allow parents to raise a violation of the legislation as a claim or defense in judicial or administrative proceedings at the federal and state levels

Keep Nine Amendment

Finally, NFRW and TFRW remain steadfast in their commitment to protect the U.S. Supreme Court from court packing. The Keep Nine Amendment is essential to keep our Supreme Court free from political interference. We must preserve its independence and integrity and we will continue to educate our members and voters on the importance of the Keep Nine Amendment and work toward its passage. More information and research on these bills can be found on the NFRW website. We will keep you informed as they move through the legislative process.



GHCFRW Nuts N' Bolts Meeting Minutes

March 26, 2024

President, Tina Gibson called the meeting to order at 9:20 AM.

The opening prayer and pledges were led by Chaplain, Alicia Cantrell.

VP of Membership, Amy Byers, called the roll of Member Clubs and confirmed there was a quorum of Members Clubs present.

Recognition of elected officers and candidates was done by President, Tina Gibson.

GHC 3rd Vice President and Chair of the Special Event, Dana Kahn, shared a "save the date" for the "Take Flight Gala" to take place on Saturday, September 7th at the Lone Star Flight Museum. A reception will be held at 6:00 PM and the event will begin at 7:00 PM. Look for more details to follow soon.

Tina Gibson, GHC President, explained the rules for voting for GHC Member Clubs. Each club has 2 votes. The club President and 1 representative. She read the section from the bylaws where this is stated aloud to those in attendance.

The Treasurer's Report was presented by GHC Treasurer, Lois Gremminger, and approved as submitted. Due to the cancellation of our January meeting because of inclement weather, Lois presented the GHC 2024 Budget. She went through each line item and described each section. The budget passed unanimously.

The next section of the meeting was the recognition honoring Club Presidents from our Member Clubs. The recognition was conducted by Nuts N Bolts Co-Chairs Amy Byers and Betsy Kindred and involved TFRW President Zenia Warren and GHC President, Tina Gibson. Each Member Club President was presented with a yellow rose, a President's Pin, and a set of flags for their club. Those in attendance then heard from candidates running for office. First, President, Tina Gibson read a brief bio of RNC Committeewoman candidate, Kit Whitehill. 


