Even if you have voted, call or text **EVERYBODY** on your contact list and urge, beg, cajole each one to vote today.


Make sure everyone votes for ALL of our candidates for judge. When we elect Republican judges, here are some improvements we will see in our courts:

TEXAS FEDERATION OF REPUBLICAN WOMEN ANNOUNCES SUCCESSFUL CAMPAIGN INITIATIVES

Austin, TX — This past weekend, the board of directors of the Texas Federation of Republican Women (TFRW) gathered in Georgetown for their quarterly meeting and heard from the leaders of various campaign initiatives on their success to date.

"This was an incredible year for our member volunteers," said President Zenia Warren. "We anticipate the success of our efforts will bear significant fruit as election results come in. Our members registered Republican voters not just in Texas, but in key battleground states, in addition to our boots-on-the-ground efforts in several contested legislative and congressional races here at home."

Warren continued, "TFRW adopted a variety of campaign initiatives this year giving our members options, offering something for everyone. Many of our initiatives were a first for TFRW and all programs were extremely successful."

Among the reported numbers:

- VEP "Voter Engagement Program" Over 600 Volunteers
 Registered 178,639 new Republican voters in Texas as of September 30th and anticipate this number will be 185,000 total after election is canvassed. Registered 164,424 new Republican voters in battleground states of Pennsylvania, Ohio, Michigan, Maryland, Montana, Nevada, and Wisconsin, with an additional 321,007 committed to register. Total calls made: 921,093. Total confirmed registration of new Republican voters: 343,063.

- Coalition por Texas
 Targeted Hispanic rural communities to vote via texting. This initiative saw an 85% increase for first time voters during the primary texting 3,500 households. Over 100 volunteers sent 200,000 texts for the general election during early voting to Hispanic voters.
- Active participation in both Women for Cruz Coalition and Trump Force 47 Campaigns
 Over 1,800 members have volunteered for Senator Cruz and over 1,000 members have committed to Trump Force 47
- 6. Election Workers and Voter Deputy Registrars Over 35% of all club members are Voter Deputy Registrars and have been actively working in their communities to register voters. In addition, at least 30% of every Club member (164 Clubs) will be working the polls as a clerk, election judge, or poll watcher.

Campaign hours reported to the National Federation of Republican Women for the period July 1, 2023, through June 30, 2024, total 2,122,831. We anticipate this number to increase by another 1,000,000 after the election.

The Texas Federation of Republican will celebrate 70 years of service to the state of Texas as a part of the National Federation of Republican Women in 2025. With over 10,000 members statewide, TFRW continues to be the most powerful political organization for women in Texas. For more information, please see http://www.tfrw.org.

GHCFRW Meeting Minutes

September 17, 2024





First Vice President, Buckley Morlot called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM. Buckley is presiding over today's meeting for President, Tina Gibson, who is with her new grandchild!

The opening prayer was led by Chaplain Alicia Cantrell. Steve Radack, candidate for Harris County Tax Assessor-Collector led the pledges.

1st Vice President, Buckley Morlot, introduced the program for the day. Jessica Colon spoke at the "Get Out the Vote Rally" in August and will not be joining us today. Buckley introduced Pasha Moore, Founder & Principal, Holland Taucher Consulting Group (HTCG) who will be speaking to us about electricity and healthcare. The information presented was extremely informative. Pasha shared background information on both topics and connected the information and their relevance to the Texas Legislative Session which begins on January 14, 2025. She encouraged GHC members to think long term when pushing for legislation for electricity and healthcare. Pasha then took questions from the members. She also left literature for members on how to get involved with the legislative session on these two important issues.

After Pasha presented her program, Buckley introduced a panel of guests speaking on the topic of community engagement. Alicia Cantrell with Coalition for/por Texas, Vanessa Ingrassia with Houston Young Republicans and Harris County GOP, and Danny Stevens with Log Cabin Republicans of Texas. Each panel guest was asked about how their outreach programs are working in Harris County and Texas. The efforts of these groups seem to be paying off! Data reflected an increase of 8% Hispanics voting Republican in the Rio Grande Valley and 19% increase in rural counties, which exceeded their goal of 5%. Houston Young Republicans recently received an award for being the largest YR group in Texas and received great press coverage when they had to cancel their meeting with the Israeli Consulate after receiving threats of violence. The meeting was rescheduled and had a huge attendance of HYRs, candidates and Elected Officials. It gave YRs a chance to meet and get to know the candidates they are trying to get elected in November. The Harris County GOP is encouraging young people to get involved through their "Leaders on the Rise Program". Danny Stevens described the long relationship President Donald Trump has had over the years supporting Gay rights and advocating for AIDS research. His group is making efforts to get the word out that the Republican Party is the right place for them based on policy and governance. The panel was well received and GHC members were allowed to ask questions of the panel.

Business Meeting

Vice President Amy Byers conducted the roll call of Member Clubs. It was determined that we had a quorum based on the numbers present.

1st Vice President Buckley Morlot shared plans for the November program. The program will be focused on getting our members ready for the upcoming Texas legislative Session which begins in January.

Vice President Dana Kahn briefly spoke about the Take Flight Special event on September 7th.She thanked members for their attendance and support. Numbers are not finalized yet and the committee has their final wrap up meeting this Friday.

Past President Sophia Mafrige was the program chair for the Take Flight Event. She brought a signed copy of the new Trump book, "Save America" she received after the event from Sergio, who is the publisher for Winning Team Publishing. This came along with a very nice note thanking Greater Houston Council for putting on such a fabulous event.

Renee Lunsford, Legislative Chair, spoke about today being Constitution Day. Our Constitution was signed 237 years ago! She reminded us of the five documents written by the Founding Fathers in Philadelphia. Renee also prepared a brief historical timeline which she printed for members to take with them to share along with pocket copies of the Constitution.

Treasurer Lois Gremminger presented the Treasurer's report. As of August 1st, we had a beginning balance of \$10,470.08. Total income was \$27,455.00 and expenses were \$14,512.07. This leaves us with a current balance of \$23,413.01. The Treasurer's report was approved as presented.

Recording Secretary Ronnye Cowell, stated the minutes from the May members meeting were shared in the June Newsletter. Acting President, Buckley Morlot as if anyone had any correction or additions. There were no additions or corrections to the minutes. A motion was made by Lois Gremminger to accept the minutes as written and seconded by SJ Swanson. The motion passed unanimously.

Hospitality Chair Joyce Chambers thanked Northwest Forest RW and RW of Katy for providing breakfast and snacks for this morning's meeting

Acting President Morlot asked for club announcements.

- Baytown RW will be hosting a meet and greet for candidates at Lee College on September 26th.
- Bergundi Cain reminded everyone about the TFRW Tribute to Women taking place on October 26th. Get your nominees in as soon as possible.
- Harris County GOP will be hosting an event on Friday, September 27th with Governor Greg Abbott. It will be a "family friendly" event with activities for kids, who attend free, and a band.
- Speed Dating with the Judges will take place at Harris County GOP Headquarters on Saturday, September 21 from 9:00 Noon. This will give voters a chance to connect and get to know the Judicial Candidates.
- Tucker Carlson will be in Ft. Bend on Wednesday, September 18 (tomorrow)

The meeting was adjourned at 11:17 AM.




